1 mile pet friendly walk 8:00

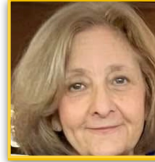

Hi ladies, I hate to be the bearer of bad news, but September, the month we are living in right at this very moment, is the worst and most active month for hurricanes! Yes, the bad news is that we are in the midst of Hurricane Season, a season that runs from June 1 to November 30. Palm Coast has been impacted by eight hurricanes since 2010, with varying degrees of wind, flooding, and storm surge. We often get the outer bands of hurricanes, and those outer bands can tear up our palm trees, flood our streets, and destroy our homes.

We moved into our Palm Coast house in May 2014, loving our tropical lifestyle of palm trees and sunny days. We planted our yard, bought the furniture, and went to the beach. A little over two years later, Hurricane Matthew came to town. We were ordered to evacuate. **Rule #1 – know your evacuation zone and tank up your car!**

We pushed both of our 80 lb Golden Retrievers into our minivan, along with clothes, snacks and dog food and headed south in a violent rainstorm. We had heard that a hotel in Orlando welcomed people with dogs. We weren't the only ones who heard that – half of Florida showed up. The hotel's ice machine was empty, the candy machine was empty, the stores in Orlando were closed and boarded up because the storm was also in Orlando! We were starving in our hotel room, so we ate our snacks, our dogs gobbled their kibble, eyed our crackers and drooled. **Rule #2 – when a hurricane is coming, have a 7-day supply of non-perishable food and a whole bunch of bottled water!**

The storm moved on and we were able to get home the next day. Palm Coast was a mess, trees were down, branches and debris everywhere. But our street was flooding and we were horrified. Luckily, the water receded before making it up our driveway. **Rule #3 – Clear drains and swales before the storm hits!**

As luck would have it, a year later, Hurricane Irma hit Palm Coast. My husband could not take another trip to Orlando, trying to get the dogs to relieve themselves in ferocious rain and wind with a million other dogs trying to do the same, so we rode out the storm at home. Power was out for over a week, we slept on patio furniture because it was cooler outside than inside. We bathed in dirty pool water and ate lots of tuna fish sandwiches. **Rule #4 – have a manual can opener ready when a storm is predicted!**

There have been no more hurricanes since 2017, just some tropical storms. The weather people say below normal hurricane activity is predicted for 2026! The bad news is that weather can change in a heartbeat. Hurricanes can change direction or gain in strength. We are supposed to prepare at the start of hurricane season for a storm that may or may not come. Just make sure you pack ice, snacks, and plenty of dog food. If you don't, your dogs will absolutely eat your snacks.
