

#### Grace Community Food Pantry sponsors these programs:

Food Pantry, Fed by Grace Backpack Program, Team Feed Flagler

- The <u>Grace Community Food Pantry</u> is now seeing about 5000 cars a month on Saturday and Sunday. The need is so great in Flagler because people and families are hurting with so many out of work.
  - DONATIONS: GCFP accepts cash donations and checks made to the order of Grace Community Food Pantry. (The Pantry purchases food from Second Harvest for about 18 cents a pound: They can get a lot of food for the buck.) Additional suggested donations dry food in original packaging and canned goods. Examples: pasta, tomato sauce, cereal, soups, canned meats, vegetables, fruits, peanut butter, crackers, and jelly, etc. Currently, The Pantry is also receiving requests for dog and cat food.
- The Fed by Grace Backpack Program began in 2013. Every Wednesday The Pantry delivers 6-8-pound bags of food to schools designated by the school district. These schools provide a backpack of food to participating students on Friday, so the students

have food for the weekend.

DONATIONS: Pop-top cans of Tuna, Chicken, Ham or Beef, Skillet Box Dinners for Tuna, Ham, Chicken or Beef, Cereal, Nutri-Grain, Granola, Cereal Bars. Oatmeal, Grits, Peanut Butter, Nutella, Jelly (no Glass), Pasta in box or canned pasta, Macaroni and Cheese, pasta Sauce, Canned Veggies such as tomatoes, corn. Greens, carrots and Beans, Apple Sauce and other canned or dried fruits, Graham Crackers, Animal cookies, Soup, stews, and chili. PLEASE NO GLASS JARS.

- <u>Team Feed Flagler:</u> This program brings churches and organizations together to make sure everyone has a Thanksgiving dinner.
  - DONATIONS: This year the virus has forced a change in the approach to the Feeding Flagler Program. Since the Team has not been able to collect food so they could provide a box of food and a turkey to each family in need, they are partnering with Winn Dixie to provide a Thanksgiving meal to a family of four for a donation of \$25.00. Cash or checks in any amount are greatly appreciated. Please make Checks payable to Grace Community Food Pantry and note "Feed Flagler" in the memo section. You can also donate via Pay Pal or credit card by visiting <a href="www.gracecommunityfoodpantry.com">www.gracecommunityfoodpantry.com</a> and selecting "Team Feed Flagler".
- Additionally, Team Feed Flagler will also be hosting sites to distribute "To Go Boxes" to those in need so they can take home a hot Thanksgiving meal. (No dine-in dinners will be hosted this year.)
- <u>Family Life Center</u>: The Mission of The Family Life Center is to provide essential support services to individuals and families to end domestic violence and sexual violence in Flagler County.
  - DONATIONS The Family Life Center is accepting donations of UNOPENED paper products, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent, diapers, food items, feminine hygiene products (shampoo, body wash, toothpaste, deodorant etc.). Gift-cards as well as "new" pajamas, socks, underwear are greatly appreciated.
- The Giving Store: For more than 25 years, during the holidays, Flagler Volunteer Services, and the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) have successfully conducted a Giving Store program in Flagler County. The Giving Tree, as it is called in December, allows children in Kindergarten through 5th grade the opportunity to select Holiday gifts for each member of his/her household FREE of charge. The goal has been to teach these children the "Joy of Giving" during the holiday season. This year, The Giving Tree was in jeopardy of being cancelled since the Giving Store was unable to conduct their Spring and Fall Rummage Sales which are the major sources of funding for The Giving Tree. Thankfully, through the generosity of Flagler residents and businesses, this event will take place in a modified version. Local children will still be able to experience the valuable lesson that it feels "better to give than receive."

Our Father's Table: Our Father's Table is sponsored by Palm Coast United Methodist Church. Every Saturday at 4:00 pm, Volunteers provide a free "Meals on Wheels" service to Palm Coast Residents who are homeless or struggling to feed their families.

DONATIONS: 1)\_Volunteers to assist in assembling the prepared meal for designated drivers to deliver. 2) Volunteers to sign up to cook a future meal for 30+ people. The Church will provide the main entree for the meal (usually chicken, beef or pork) plus, bread, dessert and water. This is a great way to cook with a friend or friends and provide a hot meal to those who are struggling.

# Volunteer Time Reporting

We are nearing the end of our calendar year 2020 reporting cycle. While this has been quite a year of challenges, you have all demonstrated the passion of your hearts with continued volunteer efforts.

I would like to summarize some helpful information as we wrap up this year. The Time Reporting page on the website is your tool for recording hours and donations.

- The Time Reporting page now contains Time Reporting Helpful Hints and Time Reporting Handbook. Both handy reference materials.
- As you accumulate hours/donations, please note that leadership and members have slightly different responsibilities.

Leadership:

Record and enter hours/donations for any committee meeting or committee activity, by

selecting the appropriate Program/Project from the drop-down menu on the website for your CSP.

Members:

Record and enter hours/donations for any volunteer activity in which you participate that is outside of a committee, by selecting the appropriate Program/Project from the drop-down menu on the website for your CSP.

- Note the following as it applies to donations:
  - Any donation you make to a non-profit organization counts. It can be recorded under the CSP category in which it falls.
  - For example, if you have donated a turtle to the Palm Coast Arts Foundation for the turtle trail, on the Time Reporting page, you would:
    - 1. Select Arts & Culture,
    - 2. From the dropdown menu of projects, select PCAF (Palm Coast Arts Foundation),
    - 3. Enter the dollar value of your donation in the IN-KIND Donation Value box.
  - o If you painted a turtle for the turtle trail, on the Time Reporting page, you would:
    - 1. Select Arts & Culture,
    - 2. From the dropdown menu of projects, select PCAF (Palm Coast Arts Foundation),
    - 3. Enter your hours and enter any non-reimbursed amounts in the IN-KIND Donation Value box.
  - Consider any other similar donations you may have made during this year.

As always, do not be shy about asking any questions at all. Your feedback only helps to improve the process and the communication. Thank you for all you are doing for our community!!!

### Civic Engagement and Outreach Committee

Anniversary Celebration during a pandemic the Palm Coast Historical Society finally celebrated this important milestone at City Hall on Saturday, October 24, 2020. A last minute air conditioning equipment failure at the Community Center forced a change of venue less than 24 hours prior to the start of the event. Nonetheless PCHS volunteers working in cooperation with City of Palm Coast employees sent out notifications and made the necessary adjustments for social distancing so that the show could go on.

To simulate the spirit of the original Welcome Center Grand Opening held on October 29, 1970 this year's attendees were greeted to the tune "Here Comes The Sun" upon entering the meeting room. George Harrison's classic hit was constant background music in the first Welcome Center when visitors came to ride the elevator to the top of the 64 foot observation tower. Storyboards, albums and digital graphics displayed images of the original model homes, dredging operations to create canals, maps, newspaper articles from the 1970's, and more.

Former ITT advertising executive Linda Kasper shared her extensive portfolio of Garfield billboards and marketing brochures from the mid-1980's and related stories of her experiences as the only female in ITT Community Development's male-dominated real estate development department. Her background in graphic design combined with her natural marketing instincts earned her numerous industry awards and successful campaigns to draw visitors and ultimately residents to Palm Coast.

Michael Chimento III shared his memories of a modern-day "Tom Sawyer" childhood. Growing up in a sparsely populated community where children rode bikes down the streets of uninhabited neighborhoods and roamed through acres of undeveloped woods provided the sort of freedom today's generation can barely imagine.

Visit the PCHS Museum in Holland Park to catch a glimpse of this bygone era. Open Wednesdays from 1:30 - 3:30 pm, Saturdays from 12 - 3 pm, or by appointment.
