Greetings from the Co-Chairs of the Health and Wellness Committee!

Thank you to everyone who made contributions in September to support our local charities: Grace Community Food Pantry (GCFP), Family Life Center (FLC), The Giving Store (TGS), and Our Father's Table (OFT). We will continue to collect donations on the third Tuesday of each month from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. This collection schedule enables us to accommodate GCFP's limited warehouse delivery drop-off schedule implemented during covid restrictions.

(<u>GRACE COMMUNITY FOOD</u> PANTRY ACCEPTS DROP-OFFS ONLY ON TUESDAY AND THURSDAY MORNINGS.).

On September 19, 2021, we collected and donated the following: *590 pounds of food & \$150.00 in monetary donations for GCFP, *\$350.00 in-kind donations and \$150.00 for FLC, *\$582.00 in-kind donations and \$100.00 for TGS. Your donations are greatly needed and appreciated by these charities.

In the following paragraphs, we have outlined the Missions and needs of each of the Flagler Organizations receiving your donations. Please take a few minutes to review this information. Thank you! Grace Community Food Pantry sponsors these programs:

Food Pantry, Fed by Grace Backpack Program, Team Feed Flagler

- The <u>Grace Community Food Pantry</u> continues to serve about 5000 cars a month on Saturdays and Sundays. Each weekend families from all over Flagler form a long line of cars along US-1 in Bunnell to wait and receive groceries from Grace Pantry for the next week. <u>DONATIONS</u> We accept cash donations and checks made to the order of Grace Community Food Pantry. (The Pantry purchases food from Second Harvest for approximately 18 cents a pound. Your monetary donations go a long way in feeding Flagler Families. Additional suggested donations dry food in original packaging and canned goods. Examples: pasta, tomato sauce, cereal, soups, canned meats, vegetables, fruits, peanut butter, crackers, and jelly, etc.
- <u>"The Fed by Grace Backpack Program</u>" began in 2013. Each Wednesday the Pantry delivers bags filled with 6-8 pounds of food to schools designated by the school district. These schools provide a backpack of food to participating students on Fridays, so the students have food for the weekend.

DONATIONS: Cans of Tuna, Chicken, Ham or Beef, Skillet Box Dinners for Tuna, Ham, Chicken or Beef, Cereal, Nutri-Grain, Granola, Cereal Bars. Oatmeal, Grits, Peanut Butter, Nutella, Jelly (no Glass), Pasta in box or canned pasta, Macaroni and Cheese, pasta Sauce, Canned Veggies such as tomatoes, corn. Greens, carrots and Beans, Apple Sauce and other canned or dried fruits, Graham Crackers, Animal cookies, Soup, stews, and chili. PLEASE NO GLASS JARS.

<u>Team Feed Flagler:</u> This program brings churches and organizations together to make sure everyone has a hot Thanksgiving dinner or a place to come and have a meal. We have included the 13th ANNUAL FEED FLAGLER's "MUSTARD SEED" Flyer for your review and consideration.

Cash donations and checks written to Grace Community Food Pantry with "FEED FLAGLER" noted on the memo line will support this annual campaign.

Family Life Center Mission of The Family Life Center is to provide essential support services to individuals and families to help end domestic violence and sexual violence in Flagler County.

DONATIONS. The Family Life Center is accepting donations of UNOPENED paper products, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent, diapers, food items, feminine hygiene



products (shampoo, body wash, toothpaste, etc.), socks, underwear, pajamas, gently used clothing (women's and children's) and gift cards to stores which sell clothing, medicines, and food.

<u>The Giving Store</u> For more than 25 years, during the holidays, Flagler Volunteer Services and the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) have successfully conducted aGiving Store program in Flagler County. <u>The Giving Store allows local children in Kindergarten through 5th grade the opportunity to select Holiday gifts for each member of his/her household free of charge. The goal has been to teach these children the "Joy of Giving" during the holiday season. Last year due to covid The Giving Store had to cancel many of its fundraising event but was able to alter this traditional holiday event in order to enable children to get gifts for their family members.</u>

DONATIONS: The Giving Store is accepting monetary donations of any amount, as well as any new or gently used items which can be given to family members of any age (infants to grandparents, male and female). Any surplus items donated will be included in their future Rummage Sales.

<u>Our Father's Table</u>

Our

Father's Table is sponsored by Palm Coast United Methodist Church. Every Saturday at 4:00pm, Volunteers provide a free "Meals on Wheels" service to Palm Coast Residents who are homeless or struggling to feed their families.

DONATIONS: The following are needed by Our Father's Table:

1 Monetary donations and canned foods with pop-top lid meals.
 2. Volunteers to assist on Saturday afternoons in assembling meals.

3. Volunteers to sign up to cook a meal for 80+ people. (This is a great way to cook with a friend or friends. The Health and Wellness Committee currently has teams of 2 to 4 people who are assisting in this effort. The Church provides the main ingredients for the meal.)

Civic Engagement

A Historic and Momentous Occassion in the History of Florida

The marble statue of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, created by renowned master sculptor Nilda Comas, is on display at the News-Journal Center in Daytona Beach from October 11 to December 12, 2021.

Admission is FREE. Sun - Sat 10 am - 3 pm.

The statue is made from marble culled from the same quarry used for Michelangelo's David. It is destined for display inside National Statuary Hall in the US Capitol in Washington DC by February 2022. The Bethune statue will be the first representing a Black person, male or female, in the state collection inside Statuary Hall.

The exhibit in Daytona Beach will include tour guides, story boards, commemorative magazines, and a short video on the life and legacy of Bethune. Mary was born in July 1875, the 15th child of former slaves, and the first in her family to learn to read and write. She established the Educational and Industrial Training School for Negro Girls in 1904 on land that bordered the city's trash dump.



That school eventually grew into Bethune-Cookman University. Dr. Bethune is considered by many to be one of the most influential civil rights leaders of the 20th century, having been an advisor to four US presidents, including Franklin D. Roosevelt.

An identical bronze statue of Mary McLeod Bethune is scheduled to be installed in Riverfront Park in Daytona Beach later next year.
