I know that Notices doesn't normally have a spot in our newsletter, but I wanted to explain a few procedures we have for seating at our meetings! While your process of checking in and getting your table number appears to be effortless, there really is a little bit of planning involved! We have several members who have preassigned tables to sit at. Reasons for these special seats can range from "You are the President, so you need to be at the table closest to the podium" to "You are a new member, so we want you to sit at the table with the Membership folks to be introduced!" Whatever the reason may be, here are the issues I would love to address:

- 1. Please **do not** sit in a chair at a table that isn't your assigned table. Even if you are simply perching in a chair to chat with someone, people looking for their seat don't know that you are simply squatting. If you are chatting with someone, please remain standing!
- 2. Please **do not** sit at a table you aren't assigned to. When this happens, people who are supposed to be at that table are forced to find seats at other tables, which then creates the endless game of musical chairs. This is a problem because people who need to be at certain tables are then kept from being there.
- 3. If you go to your table and find no seat there, please come back to registration and I will follow you to the table with our lists to figure out who needs to move. Do not just go sit down at a different table stop the cycle!
- 4. Whatever you do, **do NOT** put your table number back in the bag at the registration table after we hand it to you! If you do, you will have someone sitting in your lap for the entire meeting and that is just going to be awkward!

He died in the 1990s trying to save someone from drowning in the ocean in the vicinity of the park now named for him. At the northern end of the county is **Washington Oaks State Park.** It certainly lives up to its name with many beautiful live oaks. It has a rich history and maintains beautiful garden areas.
