This has been a stressful time for us in Grand Haven, as we navigate our way through two hurricanes. Just as we finished cleaning up the debris from Hurricane Helene, Hurricane Milton came roaring into town flooding our streets, knocking out power, causing a lot of disruption in our lives. No internet, no mail delivery, businesses closed, gas pumps with bags over them, piles of debris lining the roads of our beautiful neighborhoods.

The stories from our neighbors are plentiful. Displaced animals are showing up in our yards. One neighbor whose yard had flooded was in her lanai watching an alligator swimming a few yards from her porch! Venomous snakes are appearing in yards where they have not been seen for years. Frogs and toads were running up and down the windows in my house immediately after the storm. The Saturday after Milton hit, we had hundreds of Ibis, those beautiful white birds, in our flooded backyard eating bugs from the mud. Wild pigs are showing up again. One night I was up late working in my home office and I heard a horrible screeching noise from the woods that went on and on, and sounded like bad news. My neighbor told me it was probably a fox, in distress from all the upset in its life.

As each day goes by, we get closer to a normal environment, where life is predictable, where animals live in the woods where they are supposed to live, where water is not in our streets, but in the canals and ponds where it belongs.

We still have another month to go before this year's hurricane season is over, on November 30. Please remember to be careful when you go outside. Keep your eyes open, protect your pets and yourself, wear shoes. The animal world is upset too, and they want their lives to go back to normal too.

Please follow these guidelines when signing cards!. These guidelines will help to ensure that all cards are acceptable to the United States Postal Service for shipping and to the military.



1. Please address the card to "Dear Warrior". Be respectful and polite.



2. Write a holiday/gratitude greeting, keeping in mind that our Troops are diverse in their holiday practices and beliefs. NO GLITTER OR ANY PRODUCT THAT CAN COME LOOSE. PLEASE!



3. ***Write a personal note. For example: A personal message of peace and goodwill: We thank you for your brave and selfless service to our country. You are a true hero, and we pray for your safety and wellbeing. Thank you for your sacrifice and for the strenth you show every day. Wishing you a peaceful and blessed holiday season. With deepest appreciation.



4. Sign your FIRST NAME and LAST NAME, Grand Haven Woman's Club, Palm Coast, FL (City and State where you live).



5. FOR SAFETY REASONS, PLEASE SEND CARDS ONLY - NO ENVELOPES!
