Calling all wreath makers! The Environment Committee is again supporting the Annual Festival of Wreaths silent auction to be held at the Windsor Assisted Living Facility in December, benefiting the Flagler Humane Society. Early this month the Environment Committee put out an urgent request to all GHWC members for cat food and supplies for Flagler Humane Society. FHS had taken in some 35 cats including two very young litters in response to a hoarding situation in Flagler Beach. In all, our members collected \$589 in cat food and supplies and presented FHS with a check for \$50. Additionally, our regular September collections resulted in our contributing another \$50 check and \$247 worth of cat and dog supplies. Thank you to everyone who contributed or collected items on behalf of FHS! Also, FHS is actively soliciting volunteers. The Environment Committee has planned a visit to the University of Florida Whitney Laboratory Sea Turtle Hospital on November 15th. The trip filled up fast, so another is tentatively planned for March. Since GHWC contributes to Whitney Laboratory, our members will not be charged for the tour. Nonetheless, I suspect most participants will choose to contribute and may even sponsor one or more turtles being cared for by WL.

I recently found a baby squirrel in the middle of a neighborhood road in Grand Haven. I wasn't at first sure what furry little creature was wobbling around in front of my car. When I got out of my vehicle and scooped the little one up, I recognized it was a squirrel, so young that its eyes weren't even open. Thanks to the help of a neighbor, little Sammy went to a local wildlife rehabilitator who has assured us that the little one is doing well and has several friends.
