GHWC 5th Annual Nine & Dine Event by Beth Havens

Our Woman's Club first fundraising event of the year was a great success! Beth Havens, Paula Geppner, and Nancy Carlton were the triumvirate who planned and organized this fun event.

There were 23 teams of 89 golfers, and 94 attended the awards dinner. A very good time was had by all. The Grand Haven maintenance crew did an outstanding job cleaning up after Hurricane Ian blew through just the week before. The course was in fantastic shape, and the weather was picture perfect!

Of course, a big thank you to the Grand Haven restaurant staff and, especially, Jeri Harper, who did an outstanding job helping to plan, set up, prep, cook, and serve our delicious smoker-cookout meal.

We collected \$5,785 for the golfers' fee, \$150 for dinner-only guests, \$1,500 in Game Day Passes, \$650 in raffle tickets, \$1700 in sponsor donations, \$555 from the silent auction, and \$320 in additional donations (from Pellegrini, Tomnay, Harris, and Voight) for a total of \$10,660! The expenses for golf, food, and misc totaled \$5412.31. Therefore, we cleared **\$5,247.69**!

Of course, we couldn't have accomplished this feat without the support from our generous members who donated wine bottles for the golf awards and volunteered their time at our welcome table.
