## How does the Grand Haven Woman's Club choose the beneficiaries of our fundraising?

The women of the Grand Haven Woman's Club, GHWC, and the Grand Haven Community are so very generous in the giving of both their time and their financial support. While the members enjoy the activities that raise the funds, the community benefits the most. So how do we choose who is the recipient of the funds raised by the events?

The GHWC has a budget committee. The committee meets twice a year, once in early July to develop a budget based on the fundraising committee's estimations of the funds that will be raised from the events and activities they have scheduled through the year. 100% of the funds raised are distributed to the charitable organizations. The committee meets once again the following March to distribute any additional funds above those budgeted.

There are certain criteria that must be met in order for an organization to receive contributions from the GHWC. First the organization must be a 501(c)(3) organization. This is not just a GHWC requirement it is also a regulation of the IRS. The Organization must have a presence in Flagler County and/or provide services and support to Flagler County Residents. The organization's mission should be in synch with one of the club's community service programs.

How does an organization get on the distribution list? All contribution requests are coordinated through the club's Community Service Programs, CSP's. Every year the chairs of the CSP's complete a form for the organizations they recommend to receive funds.
