The Grand Haven Woman's Club website **GHWomansClub.org** is constantly getting updated with new information and features and can be accessed on your computer or smart device!


During the challenging times that we're going thru, the website will be your source of up-to-date information.

# **Grace Community Food Pantry sponsors these programs:**

Food

### Food Pantry, Fed by Grace Backpack Program, Team Feed Flagler

The Grace Community Food Pantry is now seeing about 5000 cars a month on Saturday and Sunday. These lines are people from all parts of Flagler County who are in need. The need is so great because people and families are hurting with so many out of work.

DONATIONS:

We accept cash donations and checks made to the order of Grace Community Food Pantry. (The Pantry purchases food from Second Harvest for about 18 cents a pound: The Pantry can get a lot of food for the buck.) Additional suggested donations dry food in original packaging and canned goods. Examples: pasta, tomato sauce, cereal, soups, canned meats, vegetables, fruits, peanut butter, crackers, and jelly, etc...

The Fed by Grace Backpack Program began in 2013. Every Wednesday The Pantry delivers 6-8 pound bags of food to schools designated by the school district. These schools provide backpack of food to participating students on Friday, so the students have food for the weekend.

DONATIONS: Cans of Tuna, Chicken, Ham or Beef, Skillet Box Dinners for Tuna, Ham, Chicken or Beef, Cereal, Nutri-Grain, Granola, Cereal Bars. Oatmeal, Grits, Peanut Butter, Nutella, Jelly (no Glass), Pasta in box or canned pasta, Macaroni and Cheese, pasta Sauce, Canned Veggies such as tomatoes, corn. Greens, carrots and Beans, Apple Sauce and other canned or dried fruits, Graham Crackers, Animal cookies, Soup, stews, and chili. PLEASE NO GLASS JARS.

Team Feed Flagler This program brings churches and organizations together to make sure everyone has a Thanksgiving dinner or a place to come and have a meal.

DONATIONS:
This year the virus has forced us to change our approach to the Feeding Flagler Program. We will NOT be able to collect food and provide boxes of food and a turkey to those in need. However, we are partnering with Winn Dixie to provide a Thanksgiving meal to a family of four for a donation of \$25.00. Cash or checks in any amount are greatly appreciated. Please



make Checks payable to Grace Community Food Pantry and note "Feed Flagler" in memo section of check.

Additionally, **Team Feed Flagler** will also be hosting sites to distribute "To Go Boxes" to those in need so they can take home a hot Thanksgiving meal. (No dine-in dinners will be hosted this year.

#### **Family Life Center**

The Mission of The Family Life Center is to provide essential support services to individuals and families to end domestic violence and sexual violence in Flagler County.

DONATIONS: The Family Life Center is accepting donations of UNOPENED paper products, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent, diapers, food items, feminine hygiene products (shampoo, body wash, toothpaste etc.) and gift cards.

#### **The Giving Store**

For more than 25 years, during the holidays, Flagler Volunteer Services, and the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) has successfully conducted a Giving Store program in Flagler County. The Giving Store allows local children in Kindergarten through 5th grade the opportunity to select Holiday gifts for each member of his/her household free of charge. The goal has been to teach these children the "Joy of Giving" during the holiday season. This year due to Covid-19 the Giving Store is in jeopardy. Our agency has been forced to cancel all our fundraising events that provide the needed funds to conduct the Giving Store. This includes two Rummage Sales and our Giving Store Luncheon. We are reaching out to the public and local businesses in hopes of raising a minimum of \$7,500 to ensure that we can have a modified version of our store so that local children can still experience giving their family members a gift and learning the valuable lesson that it feels "better to give than to receive" during the holiday season If we are unable to raise the \$7,500 by October 1, 2020 we will be forced to cancel the **DONATIONS:** The Giving Store is accepting monetary donations of any size as well as any new items which can be given to family members of any age. (infants to grandparents, male and female). Gently used donated Items will be included in future Rummage Sales.

#### Our Father's Table

**Our Father's Table is sponsored by Palm Coast United Methodist Church.** Every Saturday at 4:00pm, Volunteers provide a free "Meals on Wheels" service to Palm Coast Residents who are homeless or struggling to feed their families.

# Volunteer Time Reporting

We are nearing the end of our calendar year 2020 reporting cycle. While this has been quite a year of challenges, you have all demonstrated the passion of your hearts with continued volunteer efforts.

I would like to summarize some helpful information as we wrap up this year:

- The Time Reporting page on the website is your tool for recording hours and donations.
- The Time Reporting page now contains *Time Reporting Helpful Hints* and *Time Reporting Handbook*. Both handy reference materials.
- As you accumulate hours/donations, please note that leadership and members have slightly different responsibilities.

Leadership:

Record and enter hours/donations for any committee meeting or committee activity, by

selecting the appropriate Program/Project from the drop-down menu on the website for your CSP.

#### Members:

Record and enter hours/donations for any volunteer activity in which you participate that is outside of a committee, by selecting the appropriate Program/Project from the drop-down menu on the website for your CSP.

- Note the following as it applies to donations:
  - **Any** donation you make to a non-profit organization counts. It can be recorded under the CSP category in which it falls.
  - For example, if you have *donated a turtle* to the Palm Coast Arts Foundation for the turtle trail, on the Time Reporting page, you would:
    - 1. Select Arts & Culture,
    - 2. From the dropdown menu of projects, select PCAF (Palm Coast Arts Foundation),
    - 3. Enter the dollar value of your donation in the IN-KIND Donation Value box.
  - If you painted a turtle for the turtle trail, on the Time Reporting page, you would:
    - 1. Select Arts & Culture,
    - 2. From the dropdown menu of projects, select PCAF (Palm Coast Arts Foundation),
    - 3. Enter your hours and enter any non-reimbursed amounts in the IN-KIND Donation Value box.
  - Consider any other similar donations you may have made during this year.

As always, do not be shy about asking any questions at all. Your feedback only helps to improve the process and the communication. Thank you for all you are doing for our community!!!

Retired Navy Nurse Colonel Mary Lou Keener is researching the number of female veterans in Flagler County and will assess whether or not they have any unmet needs unique to women for which the GHWC might be able to provide assistance. Anyone with interest or insight on this issue is welcome to participate.

As one of our Citizenship initiatives the GHWC is encouraging each of you to contact Governor Ron DeSantis to select May Mann Jennings to the Florida Women's Hall of Fame in 2020. She is a former First Lady of Florida and past Present of the Florida Federation of Women's Clubs from 1918-1920. As a prominent Suffragist May was instrumental in the campaign to Win The Vote for women which resulted in the passage of the 19th Amendment in August 1920.


