This was not an easy decision, and this subject was discussed often in prior years; especially when our operating budget experienced a deficit as has been the case in the last couple years.


The GFWC has been a valuable resource for the Grand Haven Woman's Club, especially in our early years as a club.



It is an excellent example of the Craftsman Bungalow architectural style. It is now a museum that features artifacts from Flagler County. It is also the headquarters for the Flagler County Historical Society.

Ladies you have done a fabulous job working on the current Boggy Creek project while faithfully keeping up with ongoing Material Girls sewing, crocheting and knitting projects. Attendees of our monthly stuffing, hand stitching of pillows and comfort bear meetings don't realize how productive our time together has been. Each month Lucie and I deliver at a minimum 20 abdominal pillows, cancer tie pillows, comfort bears in addition to crocheted/knitted washcloths, baby hats, booties and bibs. We also drop off lap blankets for chemotherapy patients.

In addition we have individuals getting a head start on completing quilted stockings for "Christmas Come True", working on our mending project and sewing pillows and bears in preparation for our monthly meetings.
