Square Cash is one of the many tools it offers that lets customers pay on a merchant's mobile device using a credit card. This works in conjunction with Square Reader, a small device that is installed on a smartphone or tablet that reads credit & debit cards. Square states that they provide industry-leading encryption with PCI (Payment Card Industry) compliant systems (technical & operational standards that businesses must follow to ensure that credit card data is protected). The Material Girls are not letting any of this lovely spring grass grow under our feet. While continuing to fulfill our obligation to the other organizations that we serve, we are undertaking an ambitious new project.

It has come to our attention that there is a need for hats and scarves for the homeless and working poor folks who are serviced by The Sheltering Tree. So we have made a commitment to make 60 sets of hats and scarves to be given as gifts during the next holiday season. Daunting, you might think.

Au contraire! In one month these wonderful Material Girls produced 12 (or so?) beautiful sets of hats and scarves for both men and women. So we are well on our way to providing lovely handmade items to keep these folks who are less fortunate than we are, warm during the winter months.



Our last meeting was reminiscent of a "teddy bear picnic" We stuffed and accessorized about 30 bears to be donated to Advent Hospital Emergency Room. Polyfil stuffing was flying; needles and thread were working overtime, and we ended up with an assortment of bears that will bring joy and comfort to the small children who accompany their parents to the ER at Advent.

Our lovely ladies continue to produce

beautiful chemo caps and lap blankets for the patients at the Cancer Center at Advent Hospital, cancer care kits for post-mastectomy patients, and Origami Bags for the young expectant mothers who come through the Alpha Women's Center.

Several of our other projects are on an 'as needed' basis. If there is a need for knitted knockers for mastectomy patients or amenity bags for the Family Life Center, we spring into action.

As you are cleaning out closets and storage places this spring, if you happen to run across any fabric or yarn, please keep the Material Girls in mind. We thrive on donations, and it keeps our costs down considerably.

This will be my last year as chair of Material Girls. It has been a blessing to me to have been able to lead this group of wonderful women for almost four years. While I intend to remain active, the



leadership will go to two very capable women—Lucie LaChance and Michelle Kreiss Keating. I know that the group will continue to grow and our good deeds on behalf of Grand Haven Woman's Club will continue to be felt far and wide in Flagler County.
