Material Girls


MC Chairs, Lucie Lachance and Michelle Kreiss Keating

Civic Engagement CSP

Refections by Ophelia Beier

Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001, in Washington, D.C. the sun was shining. I worked at the Pentagon as an Army financial analyst.

The Nation did not realize that in a matter of minutes there would be the most horrific attack of terrorism on American soil that we had ever seen.

As I arrived at the Pentagon, running, I heard a voice telling me not to run to trouble. I did not understand what was happening to me at first, but the voice said turn around and go to my budget meeting. The voice was low. Confused and shaken, wondering who was talking to me, I turned around and went in the opposite direction. Five minutes after I turned around, American Airlines Flight 77 slammed into my office on the side of the Pentagon where I just stood, killing thirty-four of my coworkers. The Boeing 757 crashed into the Pentagon loaded with 10,000 gallons of fuel, at 345 mph. The plane penetrated the E ring between corridors 4 and 5. I worked in E ring corridor four.

The building was shaking, everything was dark, people were screaming to get out. I could feel the fire. I hear the same voice telling me to give them my hand. I was so afraid. I stretched out my hand and was pulled by force. After running in the dark with no direction, no lights, just running for my life, I made it out of the building.

I will always wonder why my life was spared. Out of thirty-seven of my coworkers, thirty-four died on September 11, 2001.
